Health Hazards (*Acute and Chronic*): <u>Inhalation</u>: May cause irritation of mucous membranes. Inhaling large quantities may cause symptoms similar to ingestion: CNS depression, nausea, vomiting, headaches, and general muscle weakness. Aspiration hazard if swallowed – can enter lungs and cause damage. Ingestion of large quantities may result in liver damage. <u>Eye contact</u>: may cause serious irritation and tearing of the eyes. <u>Contact with the skin</u>: Prolonged contact may be irritating to the skin. <u>Ingestion</u>: Can cause CNS depression, nausea, vomiting, headaches, and general muscle weakness.

Emergency and First Aid Procedures

Eyes: Irrigate eyes with water for at least 15 to 20 minutes. Seek medical attention if irritation persists. Skin: Wash contaminated areas with plenty of water. Remove contaminated clothing and footwear and wash clothing before reuse. Discard footwear which cannot be decontaminated. Seek medical attention if irritation persists or if blistering is present. Inhalation: Get person out of contaminated area to fresh air. If breathing has stopped, resuscitate and administer oxygen if readily available. Seek medical attention immediately. Ingestion: Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. If swallowed, do not induce vomiting. If vomiting occurs spontaneously, keep airways clear. Seek medical attention immediately.

Section VI - Precautions for Safe Handling and Use

Steps to Be Taken in Case Material is Released or Spilled

Spill Cleanup Procedures: For small spill, recover any free liquid and pick up the remainder with granular clay or sand. For large spills: Eliminate any sources of ignition and dike the area to contain the spill. Recover all liquid possible by use of an explosion-proof sump pump other means. Re-use material if at all possible. Pick up the remainder using granular clay or sand Waste Disposal: This product can be harmful to fish and other wildlife. Use in such a way that runoff does not contact streams or open waterways. Dispose of in accordance with all state, local and federal regulations for your area.

Precautions to Be taken in Handling and Storing

Store in closed containers at temperatures up to no higher than 120° F.

Keep away from excessive heat.

Store and use in well ventilated areas.

Drum is not a pressure vessel; never use pressure to empty.

Shelf Life – Indefinite if stored in sealed containers at recommended temperatures. Freeze-Thaw stable.
